### Christian Value;



Our new Christian Value for this half term is TRUST and the children explore this value through the key Bible story of Noah's Ark. On Monday the children were reminded about the trust that Noah put into God when he built the Ark. Miss Sutton led Friday's whole school worship, and this explored people that we trust within our community and daily lives. Today we were also reminded about our Christian Value of Peace from the second half of the Autumn Term. The school observed a minute's silence to mark the one-year anniversary of the start of the war in Ukraine and pay tribute to the courage of the Ukrainian people.



As you will undoubtedly be aware, our curriculum is built around our 5 key drivers of Inspiring, Creative, Active, Nurturing and Challenging. This week has been an excellent example of how we embrace these drivers to ensure our children have a full and balanced curriculum which prepares them well for their future.

#### Whole School Writing Day

As writing is a focus for development across our school this year, the English team have organised a series of exciting Writing Days. The children were really inspired on Wednesday by the scene in the trees that awaited them as they arrived at school. The children speculated as to why the objects were there and who put them there! This became the basis of an opportunity to develop oracy skills which are essential for the lead in to high quality writing. Vicky Peters, one of our school governors, visited during the day and was incredibly impressed with the children's engagement and enthusiasm.

#### BF Adventure and Swimming

Year 6 have had a particularly active week with swimming at Helston Pool and a trip to develop team building skills at BF Adventure yesterday. They had a wonderful time, it is always so lovely to see lots of smiling faces in the photos.
